  - Articles 3 and 6 of the Lisbon Treaty
  - Articles 20, 26, 67 and 81, Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (consolidated version)
  - Articles 7, 9, 24 and 33 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union
  - Article 8 of the European Convention on Human Rights

### BERNARD VAN LEER FOUNDATION: ACTION GRANT 2014-2017

Outcomes (as per grant)

- COPE will build a more cohesive coalition to effect change for children of prisoners → Develop frame-reflective expertise for more effective advocacy: How can we make a difference?
- COPE will build a good practice model for preventive parent support schemes that help reduce violence for children





### Strand I: FRAME-REFLECTIVE ADVOCACY

- 1. PROVIDE A BASIC UNDERSTANDING AMONG NETWORK MEMBERS OF THE CONCEPT OF 'POLICY FRAMES'
- 2. RAISE AWARENESS ABOUT POLICY FRAMES BEING USED BY COPE MEMBERS AND HOW MESSAGES ARE COMMUNICATED
- 3. ASSESS POSITIVE / NEGATIVE EFFECTS OF THESE POLICY FRAMES
- 4. ENHANCE ABILITIES TO CHOOSE THE MOST EFFECTIVE POLICY FRAMES FOR DIFFERENT POLICY PROCESSES
- 5. IDENTIFY PRIORITIES AND FUTURE STEPS FOR FRAMING COPE POLICY MESSAGES

### **A HYPOTHESIS**



We can learn to network more effectively if we explore strategic framing and try to align frames, refine messages and maximize "frame resonance" in communicating positive solutions for children.

### Strand II: Minimise violence for children via PARENT SUPPORT

DEVELOPING POSITIVE SOLUTIONS TO HELP REDUCE RISKS FOR CHILDREN, WITH AN EYE TO:

- 1. ENHANCING SUPPORT SCHEMES FOR IMPRISONED PARENTS TO OFFSET THE ALIENATION, EXCLUSION AND HUMILIATION THAT CAN DISTORT THE PARENT-CHILD RELATIONSHIP (THE CHILD "TAKING CHARGE" OF THE PARENT EMOTIONALLY).
- 2. PILOTING POSITIVE SUPPORT SCHEMES TO ENABLE PARENTS TO REMAIN EFFECTIVE, NON-VIOLENT ROLE MODELS



- → 2017: Operationalise video content for training module with focus on parent support (BvLF, Oak, with Europris, COPE member parenting initiatives)



### FRAMING: LOOKING AT LANGUAGE



Discourse Analysis: a paradigm, a mindset, a way of thinking

#### TWO CONCEPTS

1. NAMING: how an issue is defined

Broken home?
Single parent household?



2. FRAMING: how an issue is identified, represented, and legitimized

a richer, more dynamic concept that determines who will act

#### **ACTION GRANT 2014-2017**





- I. Reducing violence for children with a parent in prison
  - → COPE has been doing this since inception
  - → Working to prevent distortion of relationship by:
- helping reduce humiliation and alienation of prison environment (e.g., Europris) → parent as individual
- supporting imprisoned parent: helping parent recognise risks to child-parent relationship → parental identity

#### 2. FRAMING

a). How is issue framed? child rights? poverty reduction? reducing crime?

### b). Who takes up the issue (which agenda?)

- child rights>>MEP intergroup child rights
- poverty reduction>>MEP social affairs committee
- reducing crime>>justice ministry/prison service





### **Discourse Analysis**



#### 1. NAMING

#### a). Where is the problem?

disabilities: "handicappé" (person = disability) versus "dans une situation de handicap" (locus of problem external: context not adapted to the individual)

- b). How critical is the problem?
  air pollution + rain = "acid rain" : (emphasize urgency of problem)
- c). Degree of need for government action/policy? "broken home" versus "single parent family"
- d). COPE has explored language and role of language: prisoners' children / children of prisoners / children with imprisoned parents / children separated from a parent in prison / children distanced from a parent in prison

ALSO: invisible children, collateral victims, ordinary children facing unusual circumstances,
